

Application Criteria

- The owner must be a member of CTCC in good standing.
- In the case of co-owned dogs, the owner applying for the award must be a CTCC member in good standing at the time of application.
- Deceased dogs are eligible if the owner was a member of CTCC in good standing during the lifetime of the dog.
- All necessary documentation must be completed and submitted to the Versatility Award Committee for review.
- Only Cairn Terriers are eligible for the Versatility Award.



Purpose of the Versatility Award Program

- To recognize and preserve the inherent traits of Cairn Terriers.
- To encourage participation in activities showcasing the traits characteristic of Cairn Terriers.
- To enrich the lives of our dogs.
- To recognize the achievements of owners and their dogs.

CTCC Versatility Award requires:

- 7 or more points
- activities from at least 3 Categories

CTCC Versatility Excellent Award requires:

- 12 or more points
- a minimum of 2 points in each of 4 Categories. (Where there is more than one activity in a Category, the 2 points must be achieved in a single activity, with the exception of Category 8 where the two points may be accrued from different activities.)
- at least one title in Conformation or Earthdog/Barn Hunt

Guiding Principles

Earning the awards is challenging, but achievable.

Points are awarded for achievement, not just for effort.

Not all titles are awarded points and not all titling organizations are recognized.

For some titling organizations, only higher-level titles are awarded points.

No additional points are awarded for titles higher than those listed in the tables.

Versatility Excellent Award recipients must show engagement in a variety of dog sport activities, and also demonstrate advancement beyond a beginner's level in several of these activities.

Versatility Excellent Award recipients must also show that the dog conforms to the breed standard in structure/temperament and/or function, so must have earned a conformation or an earthdog/barn hunt title.
